1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This report summarises the findings of the Community Open Day Event held in the Crook of Devon Village Hall on Sunday 17thth November 2024. The event was held as part of the community engagement process that will inform the preparation of our Community Action Plan 2025–2030. The event was organised and promoted by the Fossoway and District CAP steering group led by Fossoway Community Development Trust.
- 1.2 Over 120 people attended the event to view the results of the community engagement work so far, and to vote for their priority projects and actions and share their ideas for the future.
- 1.3 Thanks to all the volunteers, local 'theme champions', Women's Institute bakers and providers of teas and coffee and everyone that came and took part. A special thanks to the Fossoway Primary School Choir and the Dillon Bray Country Dancers who provided the entertainment and sang and danced so wonderfully. And not least to the Crook of Devon Village Hall for the use of their lovely hall, kitchens, tables, chairs, and stage!
- 1.4 This report is 'verbatim' feedback of the comments and the votes at each theme table.

Note 1: A designed display showing the summary of the Survey, Profile and Stakeholder Views was prepared for the event and is now left with the community and is in the hands of the Development Trust. It is another useful community resource.

Note 2: The event was also an opportunity for people to see and add to comments they had made about their villages and area that could be 'mapped'. These 'community assets, needs and issues maps' will be used in future discussions by the Community Council as they prepare to submit a Local Place Plan to Perth and Kinross Council. The Local Place Plan is a way of the community making an input into the Local Development Plan process.
